

Second Amended Public Notice

NOTE: This notice has been amended to include the updated location of the Panel for Educational Policy meeting at which this proposal will be voted on. Details regarding how members of the public may access and participate in that meeting are contained in the final section of this notice.

THE PROPOSED OPENING AND CO-LOCATION OF A NEW SITE OF AN EXISTING DISTRICT 75 SCHOOL, P.S. K753 SCHOOL FOR CAREER DEVELOPMENT (75K753), WITH M.S. 61 DR. GLADSTONE H. ATWELL (17K061) IN BUILDING K061 BEGINNING IN THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

I. Description of the subject and purpose of the proposed item under consideration.

Due to the impact of COVID-19, the regular public meeting for the Panel for Educational Policy scheduled for April 22, 2020 will not be held in-person, and will instead be held via teleconference. This notice has been amended again to update the location of the Panel for Educational Policy meeting to teleconference and to provide details regarding how the public may join this meeting.

No changes have been made to the original Educational Impact Statement (EIS) for this proposal, posted by the New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) on February 24, 2020.

The NYCDOE is proposing to open and co-locate a new middle school site of the existing District 75 school, P.S. K753 School for Career Development (75K753), to be called P753K@K061, in building K061, referred to as K061, beginning in the 2020-2021 school year. P.S. K753 is an existing multi-sited District 75 school currently serving students in grades 6-12 across Brooklyn.

K061 is located at 400 Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn, NY 11225 in Community School District 17, referred to as District 17. If this proposal is approved, P753K@K061 will open and be co-located with M.S. 61 Dr. Gladstone H. Atwell (17K061), referred to as M.S. 61, an existing district middle school serving students in grades 6-8. K061 also houses the community-based organization (CBO) New York Edge.

A co-location means that two or more school organizations are located in the same building and may share common spaces, such as auditoriums, gymnasiums, libraries and cafeterias.

This notice was originally amended on March 27, 2020 to provide the updated format of the Joint Public Hearing for this proposal. The Joint Public Hearing, which took place on March 30, 2020, was held via teleconference.

II. Information regarding where the full text of the proposed item may be obtained.

The EIS is available in the main office of M.S. 61, however, at this time, due to the impact of COVID-19, most school buildings are closed, with the exception of those providing essential services.
